Ocular Studies in Dogs, Rabbits and Rats

Pre-Clinical Research Services has performed several eye studies in dogs, rabbits and rats. These studies have required ocular exams, intra-ocular pressure measurements (IOPs), intravitreal injections, intraconjunctival injections, and application of ocular drops and ointments.

Pre-Clinical Research Services completed a six month study in rats that required ocular exams on a monthly basis using an indirect ophthalmoscope and slit lamp.

They have also conducted studies in dogs measuring intra-ocular pressure following topical eye drop vs. subconjunctival injection of test articles that are designed to modify IOP. They use a Tonopen device for IOP measurements. These dogs were also examined by slit lamp and indirect ophthalmoscope. They also have access to a fundus camera if required for a study.
